Background Prior to the Diocese of Orange acquiring the Crystal Cathedral Campus, Christ Our Savior in Santa Ana was designated as the new location for a Cathedral for the Diocese of Orange. With the purchase, renovation and upcoming dedication of Christ Cathedral in Garden Grove, Christ Our Savior Cathedral Parish has been renamed as Christ Our Savior Catholic Parish. A new era has begun for this young parish with the challenge of building a new church that answers to the needs of a diverse and growing community of faith. The Christ Our Savior groundbreaking comes at a time when many Catholic parishes across the U.S. are merging or closing altogether. The groundbreaking starts the construction of the long-awaited church building by this parish first established in 2005 by Most Rev. Tod Brown, Bishop Emeritus, with founding pastor Msgr. Michael McKiernan. The parish is currently worshiping in modular building that is inadequate in size for the growing Catholic community.
