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Panel Discussion with Esteemed Local Experts to Follow Film

Angst: Raising Awareness Around Anxiety" documentary film featuring interviews with mental health professionals, and conversations with teens and parents who share their deeply personal stories about the impact of anxiety on their lives. In an emotional conversation with a younger boy, he shares that when "I started talking about things I went through...I got to the point where I understood it's OK to not be OK."

Anxiety disorders are the most common mental health challenge in America, however, the condition is highly treatable. The showing of the 55-minute film will be followed by a panel discussion moderated by SMCHS school psychologist Blake Oldfield to explore mental health warning signs, resources for help, and specific tools and strategies for coping with stress, anxiety and depression.
