DATE NIGHT IN!



Rediscover Your Spouse



Ingredients

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup finely chopped walnuts
- 54 milk chocolate kisses
- 1-1/3 cups confectioners' sugar, divided
- 2 tablespoons baking cocoa

Directions

- 1. In a large bowl, cream butter, sugar and vanilla until light and fluffy, 5-7 minutes. Gradually add flour and mix well. Fold in walnuts.
- 2. Refrigerate dough until firm, 2-3 hours. (HINT: use this time for your date activity!)
- 3. Preheat oven to 375°. Shape dough into 1-in. balls. Flatten balls and place a chocolate kiss in the center of each; fold dough around and over the kiss, completely covering it.
- 4. Place 2 in. apart on ungreased baking sheets. Bake until set but not browned, 12 minutes. Cool 1 minute; remove from pans to wire racks.
- 5. Sift together 2/3 cup confectioners' sugar and cocoa. While cookies are still warm, roll half in cocoa mixture and half in remaining confectioners' sugar.
- 6. Cool completely. Store in an airtight container.

Short on time? Use store-bought sugar cookie dough. Slice into rounds and mold each around a chocolate kiss. Bake as above.

Mix it up! Try using different kinds of kisses, so each cookie is truly a surprise!
