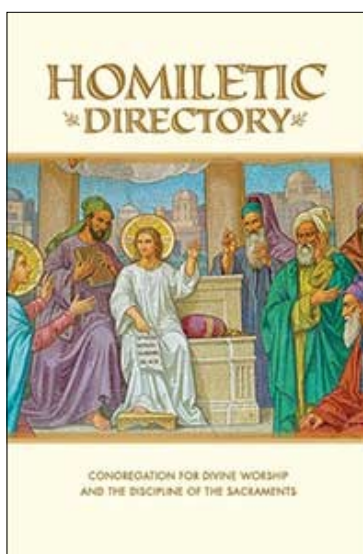

USCCB issues *Homiletic Directory*

A new and powerful resource for deacons, priests and bishops to preach effectively and with confidence has been published by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB).

Titled simply *Homiletic Directory*, the publication includes sections on the art and method of preaching, and guidance for each Sunday of the liturgical year plus weekdays, weddings and funerals.



The directory includes a large appendix with references to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* and Magisterial teachings for

each Sunday of all three liturgical years.

The *Homiletic Directory* will strengthen the homily in the life of the Church and the renew preaching ministry in parishes.

“The faithful attach great importance to the weekly homily,” says Pope Francis. “Through the homily, God touches many lives. Just as the people of his time were amazed by the teaching of Jesus (Mark 6:2).”

Bishop promulgates funeral guidelines

After a great amount of work by the Diocesan Liturgical Commission and a committee of the Council of Priests, Bishop Vann has been able to promulgate Funeral Guidelines for the Diocese of Orange.

The guidelines are

available in three languages, English, Spanish and Vietnamese and will soon be printed in pamphlets for use in parishes.

The guidelines offer an overview of the Catholic Funeral Rites along with assistance with the “Words of Remembrance.”

Deacon Tom McGuine, who is the chair of the Diocesan Liturgical Commission, was instrumental in writing and editing the guidelines.
